golf, gambling... Something for everyone!

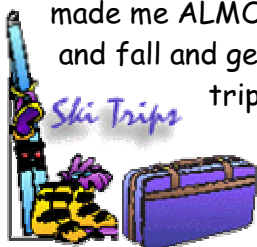


Don't forget our club's **SUMMER PICNIC**. Contact Tony to Sign Up to help on one of the picnic committees.

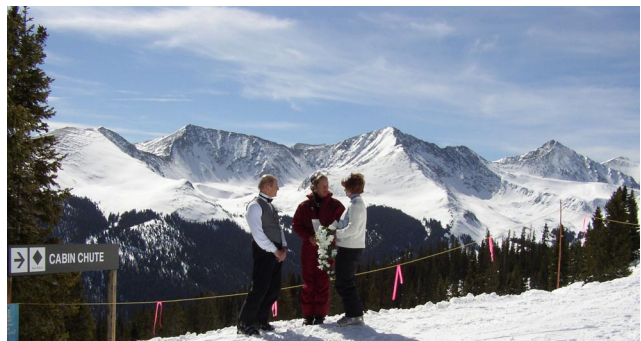
Rays of Sunshine...

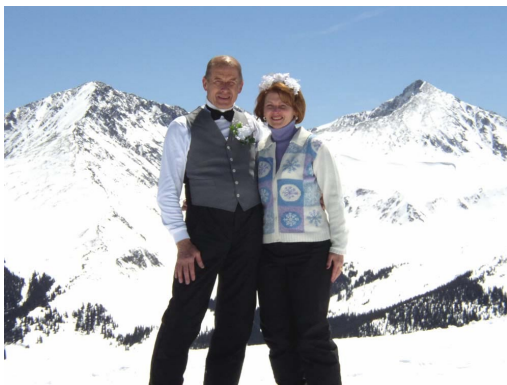

The Morzine, France & Barcelona, Spain Trip Report

(Annie's Trip Report is IN!!)

The trip to Morzine, France and Barcelona, Spain had been planned for almost a year. The excitement began when the trip documents were distributed at a pre-trip gathering at the Holiday Inn. This was the ideal time to meet with previous Morzine friends and to get to know the first time participants. This was a time for



conversation and questions as we 'dined' on pizza.

The group left Cleveland on Friday, March 14, 2003 and arrived at Fleur des Neiges hotel on Saturday, March 15, 2003. There was ample time to go into the town of Morzine for ski gear, shopping and sightseeing.



On Saturday evening we had a welcome reception at the hotel. Dave and Delphine are the owners of the hotel. At our reception, Dave volunteered to take interested skiers on a mountain tour on Sunday and Monday. He also offered to get our "hands free" ski pass to be used for the Portes du Soleil. This pass is put into a pocket and it instantly opens the ski lift gate.

Most of the alpine skiers opted to go with Dave on the mountain tour. He is an excellent tour guide. Dave knows the entire area and



saves the time that the skier would need to read a trail map. Our very capable Nordic skier chose her own trails. We all compared

stories about our day's experiences during après ski time.

Sunday was the first of six magnificent ski days. We had Sunshine every day! More mountains than anyone can ski in six days; great skiing and great views both in France and Switzerland. The area is Les Portes du Soleil (Gate Way to the Sun). It is the largest international ski area. There are 12 resorts in France and Switzerland. I repeat sunshine every day.

The trip package included breakfast and dinner for the seven days in Morzine. The first of our French meals was Saturday dinner. The breakfasts were buffet style and all dinners were sitting down and are served. Dinners began with soup and ended with yummy desserts. Of course the choice of cheese was offered.



Several people went paragliding. It is said that paragliding is the simplest way to fly, especially in winter since it is easier to slide

than to have run to take off and land. I applaud those with a fear of heights who bit the bullet and went paragliding and loved it. What a great way to tour the mountains.

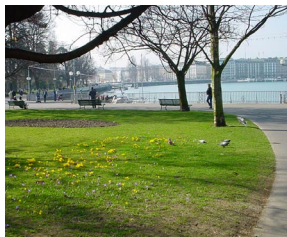


Some people took optional day trips to the historic town of Annecy, France. Others took an optional day trip to Geneva, Switzerland.

Just talk to anyone from this trip and get their opinion of Barcelona. Three days was only a teaser for me. I must go back to Barcelona.

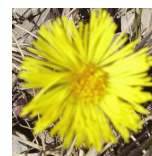
