As listed in the Ski Club Schedule, Chapin Forrest is the destination for Nordic outings on January 10 and January 24. Chapin Forrest is part of the Lake County Metroparks system, and is only 20 miles east of downtown Cleveland.

The Pine Lodge Ski center offers Cross Country Ski rentals for \$5 per hour or up to \$15 per day. Snow shoe rentals are also available, for those who choose to walk.

**Bring your dog!** There are about 6 miles of groomed trails of varied effort levels, but all trails are free to use. Ski all day from 9 am till 9 pm at no cost! (There is about 1 mile of lighted trail for skiers who just can't get enough) Lessons are available at all different skill levels, or you can try it out on your own.

hope everyone is doing their dry land training! Ski season, and racing, is not far off. The Metro Race Season begins as usual with the Qualifier at Boston Mills. This year it will be on Wednesday night, December 29th.

If you've ever been curious about what running gates is like, enjoyed testing your skill on a NASTAR course, or just miss the fun of some collegial competition, Metro racing just might be for you. There are classes for racers of every skill and age level, on skis and boards. The purpose of the Qualifier is to assess your ability and place you in the appropriate class for competition. Give it a try, you'll learn something, and have fun doing it.

There's also the Wednesday night series at Boston Mills, and gate training you can sign up for at either Boston Mills or Brandywine to make use of your new Pick a Day pass.

The full schedule should be available on the Club website. If not, go to skicleveland.com and get it there. There is one local race, a slalom, on Jan. 25 at Boston Mills. This one's easy to get to, and is also the annual charity race for Metro. For the first time ever, our Club is planning two trips this season that coincide with CMSC race events.

First up is the overnight HoliMont-Holiday Valley trip in January. On Saturday Jan. 31, Metro will be holding a duals format GS on Cindy's Run at Holiday Valley. Dual GS features side by side racing action on the thrilling but not intimidating pitch of Cindy's, their normal NASTAR course.

This is the perfect opportunity to let your wheels roll, without getting your lift pass cut by Ski Patrol! Second is the one day trip to Kissing Bridge on Feb. 28. Metro holds the last slalom event of the season at one of the most fun venues we visit. Not only is the racing great, but KB always puts on a good party for the skiers and riders. If you are considering either of these fine trips, why not also consider giving racing a try?

If so, I strongly urge you to take advantage of the Qualifier at Boston Mills. You'll get your initiation to running gates out of the way, and be fully eligible for points and, most important, prizes when you do race for real.

Getting started is easy, just give me a call, or send me an email, and I'll fill you in with all the info you need to hit the course with confidence. Typically, registration is due 3 days before each event. Signing up ahead of time saves you money, and time at the registration desk on the day of the race.

You can always sign up on site the day of the race during morning registration. We'll get you started!

### **Trustee Report**

The audit committee of the NASA Lewis Ski Club has examined the books for 2003. Everything appears to be in order. An examination of the club's costs for refreshments, postage, website, CMSC membership, etc. prompted a recommendation by the club officers for a small increase in dues. The membership approved the increase. It was the first increase in dues in well over a decade. As has been discussed previously, several one day trips did not break even or realize a small surplus as is the usual case for NASA Lewis Ski Club trips. This was not the reason for the recommendation to increase dues. A number of possible explanations for the unusual occurrence of trip shortfalls have been raised. All are speculative. A similar situation for the coming ski season is not anticipated. Active members and strong leadership are the keys to successful trips. The NASA Lewis Ski Club has both.
