Chapin Forest Trip Report January 24

After about three days of warm sunny weather, the Nordic outing planned for Saturday Feb 7 was much in doubt. The snow was essentially gone. Then it snowed Friday night with a dense, heavy, downfall of 2 – 3 inches. Very few people showed up at 11:00 am that Saturday morning, probably because it looked so hopeless only a few days before. Surprisingly, the thin snow cover was quite firm, and the bridle trails in Rocky River Reservation were very skiable. We began by crossing the parkway, just across from the Nature Center. The trail followed parallel with the river northward, passing by the shale cliffs below Guerin House. It was surprisingly sunny, with snow pasted to tree branches giving a fantasy appearance. We passed by a number of Nordic skiers going in the opposite direction, all taking advantage of the unexpected snowfall. One advantage of the river valley is the relatively flat topography even while surrounded by such steep cliffs. After passing under Brook Park road, the valley spread out much wider. We proceeded up to the I-480 overpass before turning around for the return. It was an enjoyable two hour trek along the river, with snow condition that was much better than I had expected. You would never guess that we were less than a mile from NASA GRC the entire time.
