Hemisphere Adventure Race

8:00 Sunday morning, the day before Labor Day, the NASA Adventurers met at Fairport Harbor Lakefront Park for the Lake Metroparks Hemisphere Adventure Race. The race began with about a three mile run through Fairport Harbor to find out things about the town, like: when was the lighthouse erected; how long has the local market been in business; and what is the high school's mascot - among other things. After the run, we got on our mountain bikes with only a map as our guide and headed out to the Hemisphere area. There we biked through fields and forded the Grand River twice looking for seven hidden checkpoints along both sides of the river. Most of the biking wasn't too challenging except when we made a wrong turn and chose to haul the bikes up a steep 100 ft. bank rather than backtrack two miles through brush so thick and high you only hoped the

person ahead of you hadn't stopped because you wouldn't know it until you collided with them. We helped a couple of other adventurous racers who had made the same wrong turn haul their bikes up the slope after us. (For most of the racers at this level, adventure racing is more about completing the race than about beating the other guy. Most teams collaborate and help each other when they can.) After finding all the bike checkpoints, we headed back to the transition area where two skill challenges awaited - running along eight floating platforms a la Survivor and finding a gold coin that would let us move onto the coasteering part of the race. Coasteering took place along the Grand River and included climbing up and down nearly vertical banks with the help of rappel ropes. Finally we got to the canoes and paddled to the last checkpoint without anyone getting dumped in the

river although one of the canoes took a more circuitous route than the other. After leaving the canoes, we headed back to the finish line where our final challenge awaited - snaking through drain pipes before the final sprint

to the finish. 6 hours, 24 minutes and 54.28 seconds after we started, the NASA Adventurers finished first in our category - four person coed teams with a combined age of over 100.

Nordic News

We have tentatively scheduled four local Nordic outings for the upcoming season. The first two are at Chapin Forest, on January 15 and 29. Chapin is an excellent location to learn Nordic skiing, and it is within an hour drive from NASA GRC. The facility is specifically designed to accommodate Nordic skiers, and they usually have well groomed trails throughout the season. Pine Lodge houses the ski rentals, hot/cold refreshments and the ski school operation. Both dates are on Saturday, with the Nordic Flurry race taking place on the morning of the 29th. Last years race was quite a festival, with lively entertainment for skier, and non-skiers. Contact Linda Elonen-Wright for more details about this event.

There will be a Nordic outing on Saturday February 12th in the Metroparks directly adjacent to NASA GRC. Gene Addy is the contact person for this event, which will meet at the Rocky River Nature Center. There are miles of scenic trails which follow Rocky Riv-

er, both north and south of the Nature Center.

The last scheduled Nordic Outing will be at North Chagrin Reservation on Saturday February 26th. While they no longer have ski rental facilities on-site, these may be obtained a few miles to the east, at Pine Lodge. North Chagrin has a diverse variety of terrain, including the famous ruins of Squire's Castle. I am presently looking for a volunteer to be the contact person for this outing. 
