

At our ski club's August Picnic, you watched her being crowned by our Past Ski Queen, **Cheryl Alden**. Now it's the official time to CHEER our new *NASA Lewis Ski Queen*-**Barb Cool**, as she makes her bid for the CMSC Queen title.

In addition to the pageant events, the evening will be the "Winter Kick-off Celebration for All CMSC Clubs." The evening will include *appetizers*, *beer*, *wine or soft drinks* and musical entertainment by DJ Dance Delite.

The NASA Lewis Ski Club is sending a terrific Ski Queen to this year's event. Barb currently is a Social Chair for our club. She has been making the arrangements for speakers and entertainment at our meetings, like September's visiting trainer and Justin's great demonstration on in-line skates from Geiger's.

In addition to social planning, Barb's participated on several ski trips and club outings like white-water rafting (twice). She also took up the gauntlet that Mark Hyatt our Race Chair put down last season...she joined our ski team and raced 4 times and Barb has promising plans to challenge the CC Vet Women again in 2006!

Racing will be an added background bonus to help answer the tough technical questions that all the Ski Queen Candidates face. The Ski Queens will take to the stage at 7:00 PM. Then based on their first round of interviews, the top finalists will be announced. The top candidates will then answer various interview questions-live on stage.

What type of questions might we hear these candidates being asked? To get to an insightful answer, we asked **Renee Schwartz**, the current wearer of the CMSC crown and an honoree member of the NASA Lewis Ski Club, to tell us what technical question she answered during her time on stage.

You may remember Renee at an in-line skating event (gave an informal skate technique clinic, though Victoria still can't roll backwards) and she recently went on Tim's Island Bike/Kayak Put-N-Bay day-trip.

Well, Renee remembers her technical question quite clearly, for she almost forgot the 3rd part to her answer. The judges had asked, "What are the 3 types of unweighting that occurs while skiing?" (To learn the technical answer, skip to the next page)

Renee recalls that she paused to remember the whole answer (says she felt like a deer in the headlights) and after a lengthy moment-she recalled the 3rd part, jumped back on stage to deliver an energetic, physically illustrated rebounding technique!

Lesson learned for future candidates...when the pressure is on and candidates feels like they are buggin...just jump back in and give it your best, use all your skills (body motions included), and possibly end up winning the CMSC crown! As for the audience...the suspense and answers will be worth an entrance fee.

To get the best price on a ticket, Barb will sell them at the September 6th club meeting at BW3's. Let's show CMSC how supportive we are of our Ski Queen Candidate-Go Barb! Plus, don't miss the excitement when the judges tally the end results and announce the new CMSC Queen-crowning is at 8:30P. Afterwards-its boogie time!

#### **Answer:**

- 1. Down unweighting bending at the knees to unweight the ski (intentional).
- 2. Terrain unweighting when the ground drops out beneath you leaving the ski temporarily unweighted (NOT intentional!).
- 3. Rebound unweighting the effect that occurs when the ski decambers and snaps back, like a bow & arrow, causing a momentary unweighting of the ski.

The stream drops a dramatic 220 feet over a course of two miles and has cut a steep, walled gorge. The gorge, declared a National Natural Landmark, is a unique area with numerous tree, shrub and flower species. The Tinkers Creek Gorge Scenic Overlook on Gorge Parkway offers a spectacular vista particularly in the Fall.

The NASA Lewis Ski Club is going to meet on <u>Sunday</u>, <u>September 18th</u>, <u>2005</u> (<u>12:00P</u>). We are going to hike the Gorge Parkway Trail. (Hilly, a 6.25-mile trail)


The club is in process of making arrangements to have a **Naturalist** join the group for an **hour's talk** (tentatively scheduled for 1-2P) on the features of Tinker's Creek (geology, floral, fauna). Details are still being worked... Would like to have approx. **15 people!** Join us for the talk (kids & leashed dogs are welcome)!

Where are we going? Check out the map for clear details! The entrances for the trail are off Button, Dunham Egbert and Willis Roads. The NASA Lewis Ski group is going to **park at Hemlock Creek Picnic Area** (#2 on the map) at (11:45A). The trail itself begins at Alexander Rd. in Walton Hills, and travels along Overlook Lane, Gorge Parkway, and Egbert Lane, to Union Street in Bedford, connecting with South Chagrin Reservation via Hawthorn Parkway.

# Jasper, Canada and Banff, Canada Trip Report

The NASA Lewis Ski Club spent eight wonderful days in the Canadian Rockies for a ski holiday. Upon arrival at the Edmonton airport we had arranged for box lunches to be available so that we could be on our way immediately. There were great views on the ride from Edmonton to Jasper.

The Fairmont Jasper Park Lodge was our 'home' for three days. The accommodations are a village of chalets and log cabins connected by picturesque paths. On the paths there is likely to be real wildlife at anytime. There is also the beautiful Lac Beauvert. The area is surrounded by majestic mountains.

We had a wine and cheese party to start the week.

Skiing, snowboarding and telemarking were done at Marmot Basin ski area. There was lots of area to cross-country ski. An ad for Marmot Basin states: "Imagine a place where snow comes from heaven, not from earth. A place where you spend more time on your favorite run rather than in lift lines. A place where the wildlife is not limited to party animals but includes deer, elk and other creatures."

One entire day was planned for travel through the Jasper National Park. We made a stop at the Athabasca Falls located off the Columbia Icefields Parkway. Some of our super group made snowballs to clean the side windows of our tour bus. Thanks gang. Another stop was made at an off road hotel that was very charming. Our next planned stop was at the Fairmont Chateau Lake Louise. We spent time there walking out on the frozen Lake Louise, taking pictures, shopping and having lunch. The weather was perfect for our tour day. Sunny skies allowed us to see the peaks of the rugged Canadian Rockies.

Our lodging in Banff was at the Ptarmigan Inn that is ideally located in the heart of the majestic Rocky Mountains, just a two minute walk from downtown Banff. We had a choice of three mountains on which to play. They were Lake Louise, Sunshine Village and Mt. Norquay.

We spent four days and five nights in Banff skiing, shopping, dog sledding, at natural hot springs and partaking of nightlife.

We had a wine and cheese party in the hallway of Ptarmigan Inn on our last night. It was fun for us and maybe a little noisy for other hotel guests.




