NOMINATIONS FOR SKI CLUB OFFICES

It's time again to submit nominations for ski club officers. Remember, the Lewis Ski Club needs YOU! It does not run by itself. Please nominate yourself or any other Ski Club member for one of the following offices. A summary of the duties of these offices are listed below. Our annual election will be held at the April meeting.

PRESIDENT:

The President presides at all Club meetings, appoints chairpersons for all committees, and is a standing member of all committees except for the Nominating Committee. He/She shall promote publication and review of the Activity Coordinator's Guide on an annual basis. He/She shall perform all duties incident to the office. He/She must be an on-site employee at the NASA Glenn Research Center.

ALPINE VICE-PRESIDENT:

The Alpine V.P. is responsible for overseeing the Club's downhill ski and snowboard programs, issues the Activity Guide, in conjunction with the Nordic V.P. and Activities V.P., to each Activity Coordinator, and performs the duties of the President in the absence of the President or as delegated by the President.

NORDIC VICE-PRESIDENT:

The Nordic V.P. is responsible for overseeing the Club's cross country ski program, issues the Activity Guide, in conjunction with the Alpine V.P. and Activities V.P., to each Activity Coordinator, and assists the Alpine V.P. in performing the duties of the president.

ACTIVITIES VICE-PRESIDENT:

The Activities V.P. is responsible for overseeing all the activities other than those associated with the club's on-snow program including, but not limited to, biking, inline skating, canoeing, white water rafting, parties, and other such recreational activities, issues the Activity Guide, in conjunction with the Alpine V.P. and Activities V.P., to each Activity Coordinator, and assists the Alpine V.P. and Nordic V.P. in performing the duties of the president.

RECORDER :

The Recorder shall keep accurate and complete minutes of all meetings and report them to the Club members. He/she shall notify the members of the Board of all Board meetings.

PUBLICITY DIRECTOR:

The Publicity Director shall have charge of all club publicity, oversee distribution of the club newsletter, notify all members of all club meetings and perform all other duties incident to the office.

TREASURER:

The Treasurer shall handle the general funds of the Club, keep an up-to-date record of all Club finances, and report receipts, disbursements, and account balances at the monthly membership meeting.

TRUSTEES :

The Board of Trustees will provide guidance and oversight of the activities of the Lewis Ski Club, Inc. The Trustees shall be guardians of this Constitution, and shall be responsible to the members to ensure that all articles and sections of this governing document are followed.

The Board of Trustees, along with club Treasurer, will perform the annual audit of the club treasury. The Board of Trustees, along with the President and Vice Presidents, will perform an annual review of the Activity Guide.

The Board of Trustees will provide the members with an annually written report of their activities. Verbal reports will be given at club meetings. The Trustees will not be voting members of the Executive Board.

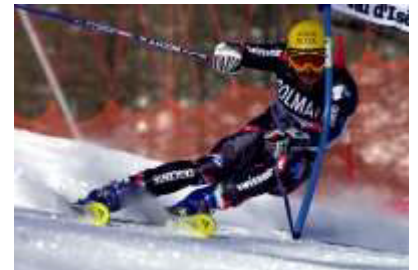

Racing News by Mark Hyatt

Well, the season is past the half way point, and the Big One is coming up. A strong NASA Team is headed to Bristol Mountain for CMSC's Combined Race Weekend. We will be well represented with 7 racers planning on competing in the SuperG, GS and Slalom. Full results will be published in the April newsletter. Now, to report on our season thus far. We haven't won any team races in Division 2, yet. It's kind of like the US vs Austria in alpine skiing. We have some bright stars, and great individual performances, but their depth kind of overwhelms us. We have won more medals than Bode, though. Team results have been very good this year. We've scored over 90 points twice, and finished fourth in Division 2 twice. We missed at another fourth by only two points in the Slalom at Holiday Valley, and only 17 points away from third. Our numbers for Combined bode well for the team to have one of it's best showings ever.

Individually, Lisa Lambert had a 3rd in GS and a 5th in slalom in BW at Holiday Valley. The team has depth in CCVW, with three of six competitors in the class. Barb Cool has the most points on the Team, with three wins, 3rd twice, and a 5th place finish. If not for two DQs at Bristol, she would be contending for racer of the year. She can really give the class leader pause with a strong showing at Combined. Therese Telzrow has had a good campaign so far as well, with a third, three fourths, and a sixth place finish. Elise Frankenfield is the dark horse going to Combined, placing 5th and 2nd at the Holiday Valley races. Cheryl Alden and Victoria Briscoe have joined the ladies in CCW, and mixed things up a bit. Cheryl has a 3rd and a 4th, and Victoria scored a 3rd in her first race at Peak n Peek. Both endured the DQ learning experience at Boston Mills, Victoria as the leader after Run 1.

The men on the Team have faired quite well so far, also. Your Race Chair managed two podiums in three slaloms, 2nd, 5th, and 3rd, at Kissing Bridge, Peek n Peek, and Boston Mills, respectively, in BM. Those who were there witnessed a spectacular finish in the second run at Boston Mills! Bruce Frankenfield finished fifth and third at Holiday Valley in CCM. CSB has seen some surprising results, with Bruce capturing a win in the first race at Holiday Valley, and your Race Chair following it up at Kissing Bridge. Mark added two 3rds as well, at Peak n Peek and Boston Mills. Too bad there's no snow board races at Combined!

LATEST RESULTS FROM COMBINED:

We have a Combined Champion on our Team! Bruce Frankenfield won the Combined Championship in the CCM Class this past weekend at Bristol Mountain. He earned it too, winning both the Super G and GS on Saturday, and finishing second in the slalom on Sunday. Since they used a spilt group format, Bruce's class raced on the "Big Hill" with Group 2, an unaccommodated challenge for CCM. Congratulations to Bruce, and the rest of the NASA Race Team, for a fine Combined performance!

That brings us up to date for the year. We'll recap the rest of the season in the next newsletter.

Holimont Ski Trip Report

Whoever said that we wouldn't go skiing needs to have a little more faith. Granted, we didn't see any snow until we got to Holimont, but there was snow and we did ski. Skiing in 40+ degree weather is not ideal but I don't think that anyone could say that they did not have a fun day. Half of the slopes and lifts were open providing enough for all to ski to their hearts content. There were no lift lines as a result of the thinner than normal crowd.

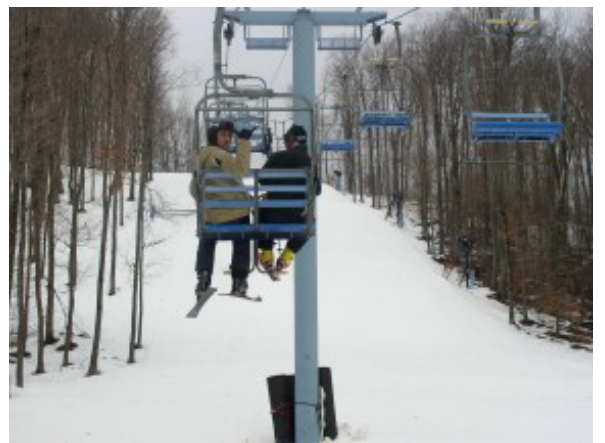

- 2. WITHDRAWAL & CHANGE** Lewis Ski Club may withdraw any trip from its schedule at any time; may refuse to accept or retain any person as a participant at any time for any reason; and may change the itinerary at any time.
- 3. RESPONSIBILITY** Lewis Ski Club is acting gratuitously for the applicant and shall not be responsible or liable for any loss of damage to baggage, property, or for any loss, injury, death, accident, delay, inconvenience or any other loss occurring during or occasioned by applicant's participation or lack of participation in any trip.
- 4. PASSPORT/PROOF OF CITIZENSHIP** For trips out of the USA, participants are responsible for having up to date and valid passport, visas and proof of identification and citizenship.
