President's message...

We're starting a new term for the club officers this month. It takes the combined efforts of many to make the club viable and these three have been key to that effort. Thank you all! I'd like to also welcome new officers Jan Neuman, Treasurer, and Larry Anderson, Nordic V.P. Thank you both for volunteering to commit your time and efforts to the club.

As we move now through the spring and into the summer, off-snow activities are filling the calendar. Activities V.P. Therese Telzrow, with the help of many, is putting together quite a variety of events and activities for the club. Be sure to check out the calendar and Therese's list in this newsletter.

We've also been working on planning our week-long trips and putting together a trip schedule for next ski season. We will again be sponsoring some great trips, so stay tuned for further details when plans are finalized.

Week-long trips have always been a challenge to organize. This year is no exception, and, in fact, promises to be even more difficult than most. Last season our trip coordinators had to deal with the very real possibility that a fuel surcharge would be added to the price of each plane ticket. Some last-minute scrambling by trip organizers enabled the club to avoid passing the charge onto the trip participants. With fuel prices continuing to rise, we may not be able to avoid such charges in the future. Higher fuel prices affect all of us; the airlines especially so. They are being forced to look at new ways to reduce costs and generate new revenue. Frontier Airline has filed for bankruptcy, while Delta and Northwest have petitioned to merge operations. I wouldn't be surprised to see other airlines take similar steps. One particularly annoying policy being adopted by United is a \$25 baggage fee for skis, golf clubs, etc. This charge is to be levied each way for a total of \$50 roundtrip. The charge is to take effect May 5, 2008. We have yet to see if other airlines adopt similar charges.

As I mentioned, the uncertain airline environment will likely make setting up contracts for trips next ski season difficult. Nonetheless, we will fight very hard to put together the best ski trips we possibly can for you, the members of the NASA Lewis Ski Club.

Remember, we don't have a meeting in May, so see you in June!
