

Take A Hike 1: Rocky River Nature Center (North Olmsted) Hike Trip Report

The weather forecast called for windy conditions, but that didn't stop a hardy group of intrepid hikers from going outdoors and getting in shape for the ski season. Five of us (4 people: Fred Merchant, Te-



resa Monaco, Jim Slifka, Therese Telzrow and 1 dog: Angie—Fred's dog) set out from the Rocky River Nature Center on Saturday, May 9, 2009. We survived the infamous 135 stairs (independently counted and verified by both Jim and Therese), and enjoyed an incredible view at the top. The wind felt wonderful after all that stair climbing. We hiked up and down hills and stairs, and also traveled on the All-Purpose Trail (relatively flat). Conditions were slightly muddy, but we managed to find some dry spots to plant our feet. We visited the wildflower

garden near the nature center, and saw some beautiful wildflowers on our hike. Angie led the pack. She usually had to wait for her two-legged friends, unless she found something interesting to sniff or if she wanted to jump in the mud. Take a Hike 2: Brandywine Falls (Cuyahoga Valley National Park) Hike Trip Report

The weather forecast called for thunderstorms, but that did not stop a group of thrillseekers who laughed in the face of danger and hiked to Brandywine Falls. Seven of us (6 people--Frank Boldizar, Jack Fiening, Pam Korenewych, Billie MacIntyre, Fred Merchant, and Teresa Monaco; and 1 dog - Angie (Fred's dog)) set out from the Stanford Youth Hostel in Peninsula, OH. It was cloudy but it was not raining. Surprisingly, the trail was not very muddy. After climbing some hills, we reached the falls. Brandywine Falls was absolutely beautiful, and since it had been raining that week, it was in its full glory. It is a 60 foot waterfall, and it is the most popular destination in Cuyahoga Valley National Park. We then walked over to the Inn at Brandywine Falls. It wasn't open at the time, but we did look at the chickens and roosters on the property.

Angie had a great time running through the relatively dry creek beds. We found out that Angie does not like water. Angie would stop in her tracks near the river and the falls. Fred had to perform a dog rescue and carry her (note to self: next life, must come back as Fred's dog, she has it good). Frank Boldizar kindly pointed out poison ivy to us, and luckily no one was affected. Billie MacIntyre showed us 1.6 billion year old rocks (basalt) and pink granite (that master's degree in Geology comes in handy on these hikes). Billie and Pam Korenewych were busy identifying different wildflowers on our hike. We were never in any danger of being lost because Jack Fiening (retired United Airlines pilot) was checking his Global Positioning System (GPS) Navigation Device for us.

We took a different route on the return trip, and we got a chance to do a river crossing and scramble over some rocks. Once we got back to our cars, only then did it start raining.

Afterwards, we went to the Winking Lizard in Peninsula for dinner and drinks (thus cancelling the health benefits of our hike, but it was fun). Fred Merchant entertained us with stories of his trip to Antarctica, including the ballistic nature of penguin defecation. In other words, do not stand behind a penguin--you may get splattered.

It took us 2-1/2 hours to hike approximately 3-1/2 miles. Overall, we had a wonderful time.
