Nordic News

Local cross country skiing (Lake Isaac) Jan and Ray Neumann told me about a nice trail to go cross country skiing for beginners--Lake Isaac. Lake Isaac is part of the Lake to Lake Trail for the Cleveland Metroparks Big Creek Reservation, with the other lake being Lake Abram. I decided to check out this location on Sunday, February 28, 2010. It had snowed a lot that week, so it was a good time to practice cross-country skiing. There would be lots of snow to cushion the impact if I fell! I easily found the trail because I received excellent directions from Ray Neumann. From the parking lot, I walked to the right onto a boardwalk. From there, I put on my skis and went across the trail to a bridge. Immediately to the left there was a trail. That was a little difficult for me to maneuver since it wasn't straight, but I managed. It was a little windy and chilly because the area was exposed, but soon I went into the woods. I saw a deer leap across the path. There was a slight uphill climb, and then I encountered the frog trail. It is a loop. I took the right side, which ended up having more uphill (which I like, I have problems going downhill). I looped twice around the trail. Luckily, there was no one there, so I got a lot of good skiing. I didn't even fall once! I noticed some feeder trails that had a steep drop, so more experienced skiers could get some practice. It took me about an hour to ski, but it probably would be faster for other people. I highly recommend this trail to others. Article by Teresa Monaco

Club Constitution Changes and Ski Club Officer Elections to be voted on at the April Meeting

Proposed Constitution Changes (Changes are Highlighted In Red)

The following paragraph (Article IV, Section 4):

(c) Nominating Committee. A Nominating Committee of three or more members will be selected by the general membership at the regularly scheduled February meeting. This committee will select a chairperson from among themselves. The Nominating Committee will solicit nominations for the Executive Board from all club members and will contact all nominees, each of whom must be a current club member. The Committee will report its progress at the March meeting. Candidates for offices will be published in the April newsletter. Nominations will also be accepted from the floor at both the March and April meetings.

Shall be amended to read:

(c) Nominating Committee. A Nominating Committee of three or more members will be selected by the general membership at the regularly scheduled February meeting. This committee will select a chairperson from among themselves. The Nominating Committee will solicit nominations for the offices of the Executive Board from all club members and will contact all nominees, each of whom must be a current club member. Members of the Nominating Committee are not eligible to be nominated for office. The Committee will report its progress at the March meeting. Candidates for offices will be published in the April newsletter. Nominations will also be accepted from the floor at both the March and April meetings.

The following ARTICLE:

ARTICLE VIII. AMENDMENTS.

An amendment to these articles may be adopted at a regularly scheduled meeting of the club, where a quorum is present, by a 2/3 affirmative vote of the members present providing that it has the sponsorship of at least two club members and has been published prior to the club meeting at which the vote is taken. Amendments so adopted will be incorporated into the body of the Constitution.

Shall be amended to read:

ARTICLE VIII. AMENDMENTS.

An amendment to these articles may be adopted at a regularly scheduled meeting of the club, where a quorum is present, by a 2/3 affirmative vote of the members present providing that it has the sponsorship of at least two club members and has been published at least 30 days prior to the club meeting at which the vote is taken. The following Bylaw:

An amendment to these bylaws may be adopted at a regularly scheduled meeting of the Club, where a quorum is present, by a 2/3 affirmative vote of the members present providing it has the sponsorship of at least two club members and has been published prior to the club meeting at which the vote is taken. Amendments so adopted will be incorporated into the Bylaws.

Shall be amended to read:

1. AMENDMENTS

An amendment to these bylaws may be adopted at a regularly scheduled meeting of the Club, where a quorum is present, by a 2/3 affirmative vote of the members present providing it has the sponsorship of at least two club members and has been published **at least 30 days** prior to the club meeting at which the vote is taken. Amendments so adopted will be incorporated into the Bylaws.

The following BYLAW:

2. COMMITTEES AND CHAIRPERSONS

The President shall, upon assuming office, or at any other time it is required, form the following committees and appoint the following chairpersons:

- (a) Refreshment Committee – provides refreshments (beverages and snacks/food) for general club meetings
- (b) Membership Committee – oversees and updates club membership roster
- (c) Sunshine Committee – sends greeting cards on behalf of the club to members experiencing significant life events such as weddings, births, hospitalizations, injuries, deaths, etc.
- (d) Metro Representative – serves as official representative for club to the Cleveland Metropolitan Ski Counsel (CMSC)
- (e) Race Chairperson – coordinates club's participation in the CMSC racing programs
- (f) Social Committee – coordinates speakers and programs for general club meetings
- (g) Trip Committee – determines trip schedule for upcoming ski season and provides guidance for ski trip coordinators
- (h) Web Curator – Oversees and updates the club's website

Shall be amended to read:

2. COMMITTEES AND CHAIRPERSONS

The President shall, upon assuming office, or at any other time it is required, form the following committees and appoint the following chairpersons:

- (a) Refreshment Committee – provides refreshments (beverages and snacks/food) for general club meetings
- (b) Membership Committee – oversees and updates club membership roster
- (c) Sunshine Committee – sends greeting cards on behalf of the club to members experiencing significant life events such as weddings, births, hospitalizations, injuries, deaths, etc.
- (d) Metro Representative – serves as official representative for club to the Cleveland Metropolitan Ski Counsel (CMSC)
- (e) Race Chairperson – coordinates club's participation in the CMSC racing programs
- (f) Social Committee – coordinates speakers and programs for general club meetings
- (g) Trip Committee – **reviews and updates the Activity Coordinators Guide**, determines trip schedule for upcoming ski season, and provides guidance for ski trip coordinators. **Appointees should be members who have experience, or desire to serve, as Activity Coordinators.**

(h) Web Curator – Oversees and updates the club’s website

The following BYLAW:

3. SKI CLUB ACTIVITY COORDINATOR

A Ski Club Activity Coordinator is a club member who has volunteered to organize an activity for the club. Ski Club Activities include, but are not limited to, alpine and Nordic ski and snowboard trips, picnics, parties, white water rafting trips, canoe trips, bike trips, inline skating, hiking, theme park trips, baseball games, etc. The Activity Coordinator must follow ski club policies and guidelines as set forth in this club constitution. Common club practices for running activities are described in the Ski Club Activity Coordinators’ Guide.

The Activity Coordinator of a Lewis Ski Club activity or club trip shall abide by the Lewis Ski Club's policy of "Activity/Trip Process Flow"; attached and incorporated herein as Attachment A to the Constitution.

Shall be amended to read:

3. SKI CLUB ACTIVITY COORDINATOR

A Ski Club Activity Coordinator is a club member who has volunteered to organize an activity for the club. Ski Club Activities include, but are not limited to, alpine and Nordic ski and snowboard trips, picnics, parties, white water rafting trips, canoe trips, bike trips, inline skating, hiking, theme park trips, baseball games, etc. The Activity Coordinator must follow ski club policies and guidelines as set forth in this club constitution. Common club practices for running activities are described in the Ski Club Activity Coordinators’ Guide.

~~**The Activity Coordinator of a Lewis Ski Club activity or club trip shall abide by the Lewis Ski Club's policy of "Activity/Trip Process Flow"; attached and incorporated herein as Attachment A to the Constitution.**~~

The following BYLAW:

4. DUES, ACTIVITY FEES, NON-REFUNDABLE DEPOSITS, AND REFUNDS

Dues shall be \$10.00/year for an individual membership and \$15.00/year for a family membership when paid on or before November 15th. The membership dues shall be \$15.00/year for an individual membership and \$20.00/year for family memberships when paid after November 15th, except for first time members where the \$10.00 and \$15.00 amounts shall apply as above. The dues will cover membership from October 1 to September 30 of the following calendar year.

Activity Coordinators are empowered to make non-refundable deposit charges in accordance with the guidelines in the Activity Guide. Activity Coordinators shall conceive and publish the refund policy for any activity prior the collecting any fees for the activity.

Shall be amended to read:

4. DUES, ACTIVITY FEES, NON-REFUNDABLE DEPOSITS, AND REFUNDS

Dues shall be \$10.00/year for an individual membership and \$15.00/year for a family membership when paid on or before November 15th. The membership dues shall be \$15.00/year for an individual membership and \$20.00/year for family memberships when paid after November 15th, except for first time members where the \$10.00 and \$15.00 amounts shall apply as above. The dues will cover membership from October 1 to September 30 of the following calendar year.

Activity Coordinators are empowered to make non-refundable deposit charges in accordance with the guidelines in the Activity [Coordinator's](#) Guide. Activity Coordinators shall conceive and publish the refund policy for any activity prior the collecting any fees for the activity.

The following BYLAW:

6. RESERVATION POLICY

A reservation in a Lewis Ski Club activity is secured only by making a specified monetary deposit. The amount of deposit required will be determined by the Activity Coordinator.

Shall be amended to read:

6. RESERVATION POLICY

A reservation in a Lewis Ski Club activity is secured only by [making submitting a specified monetary deposit and a signed Trip Application and Agreement Form to the Activity Coordinator](#). The Activity Coordinator will determine the amount of deposit required.

The following BYLAW:

7. ADVANCE OF FUNDS FROM THE TREASURY

The Treasurer will provide advances from the treasury to an Activity Coordinator only if there is an expectation of repayment to the treasury from funds collected from the participants of the activity. These advances are usually made for the transportation or lodging deposits, which are required before all fees are collected from the participants of the activity. A trip budget page (Appendix A, Activity Guide), showing the expected expenses and recommended price must be submitted to the Executive Board before an advance may be authorized.

Shall be amended to read:

7. ADVANCE OF FUNDS FROM THE TREASURY

The Treasurer will provide advances from the treasury to an Activity Coordinator only if there is an expectation of repayment to the treasury from funds collected from the participants of the activity. These advances are usually made for the transportation or lodging deposits, which are required before all fees are collected from the participants of the activity. A trip budget page (Appendix A, Activity Guide), showing the expected expenses and recommended price must be submitted to the Executive Board before an advance may be authorized. [The Treasurer will provide advances from the treasury only if a cash transaction statement accompanies the request.](#)

PRESIDENT: The President presides at all Club meetings, appoints chairpersons for all committees, and is a standing member of all committees except for the Nominating Committee. He/She shall promote publication and review of the Activity Coordinator's Guide on an annual basis. He/She shall perform all duties incident to the office. He/She must be an on-site employee at the NASA Glenn Research Center.

ALPINE VICE-PRESIDENT: The Alpine V.P. is responsible for overseeing the Club's downhill ski and snowboard programs, issues the Activity Guide, in conjunction with the Nordic V.P. and Activities V.P., to each Activity Coordinator, and performs the duties of the President in the absence of the President or as delegated by the President.

NORDIC VICE-PRESIDENT: The Nordic V.P. is responsible for overseeing the Club's cross country ski program, issues the Activity Guide, in conjunction with the Alpine V.P. and Activities V.P., to each Activity Coordinator, and assists the Alpine V.P. in performing the duties of the president.

ACTIVITIES VICE-PRESIDENT: The Activities V.P. is responsible for overseeing all the activities other than those associated with the club's on-snow program including, but not limited to, biking, inline skating, canoeing, white water rafting, parties, and other such recreational activities, issues the Activity Guide, in conjunction with the Alpine V.P. and Nordic V.P., to each Activity Coordinator, and assists the Alpine V.P. and Nordic V.P. in performing the duties of the president.

RECORDER: The Recorder shall keep accurate and complete minutes of all meetings and report them to the Club members. He/she shall notify the members of the Board of all Board meetings.

PUBLICITY DIRECTOR: The Publicity Director shall have charge of all club publicity, oversee distribution of the club newsletter, notify all members of all club meetings and perform all other duties incident to the office.

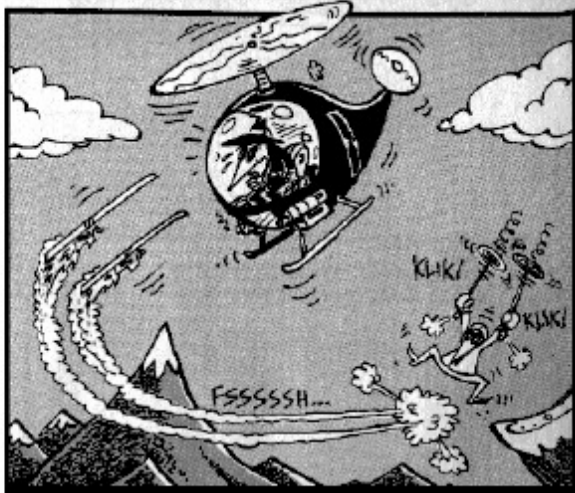
