Everyone on the trip was able to challenge themselves on some of North America's steepest terrain while also enjoying breathtaking views offered by the Tetons. Besides skiing my dream mountain, highlights included off trips to Targhee, Yellowstone and Grand Teton National Parks, whether by van, skis, or snowmobile. To cap off the trip, the town of Jackson hosted the kickoff of ceremonial dog sled racing complete with free hot chocolate and a stunning fireworks display from the base of the Snow King slopes.



The journey began with a moderately easy check-in at Hopkins early Saturday morning, where the group gathered at the gate to greet each other and collect a surprise goody bag to ease their bellies through the travel day. After making new friends on the flights, we were greeted at the Jackson airport with complimentary OJ and mimosas, along with the few members who came in on other flights, and every-

one's bags! From there we hopped on a bus ride that led us by the local Elk Refuge to the grocery store, and then finally the 49er Inn, right in downtown Jackson.
