
# NASA Lewis Ski Club

Here are a couple fun facts about Mt. Bachelor:

- Mt. Bachelor is the seventh largest ski resort in the U.S., with 3,683 acres of skijable land.
- Of its 88 trails, 15 percent of beginner, 25 percent are intermediate and 35 percent are expert.
- The longest run in 4 miles which would take you an average of 16 minutes to ski down!
- With 3,364 foot vertical, you can ski without being constantly winded!
- Mt. Bachelor has a long ski season open 180 days last season!


