Alpine Update – IKON and Epic Passes

If you are planning to buy the IKON pass or EPIC pass, purchasing early <u>through the Club</u> will give you some great discounts. Be sure to read the term and condition carefully before purchasing. Below are the links and related details:

IKON Pass

- As a qualified group, guests get preferred <u>group</u> <u>pricing</u> until May 18th
- IKON <u>Full</u> Pass purchases will receive trip credit of \$50 (no reward gift cards)
- IKON <u>Base</u> Passes purchases will receive a trip credit of \$30 (no reward gift cards)
- Guests with deferral credits from unused 20/21 passes may use those credit via this link. Those passes will not earn any trip discounts.
- Guests with 'COVID credits' (the smaller amounts due to resorts closing) are not able to apply those credits via these links. If they want to apply those credits they'll have to buy directly from IKON and would NOT qualify for the trip discounts offered.
- Base Pass does NOT include Jackson Hole
 Mountain Resort or Aspen Snowmass. Upgrade
 to Ikon Base <u>Plus</u> Pass which includes 5 days at
 each Jackson Hole Mountain Resort & Aspen
 Snowmass.
- College, Nurse & Military pass products must be purchased *directly* from IKON.

Epic Pass

- Epic did not list when their prices will go up
- <u>Full</u> Epic Pass purchases get \$50 trip discount (no reward gift cards)
- Epic <u>Local</u> or Tahoe Local pass purchases get \$30 trip discount (no reward gift cards)
- Epic <u>Day Pass</u> 4, 5, & 6 day purchases get \$20 trip discount. (no reward gift cards)






It was exciting to see everyone (there were 14 of us) especially since we haven't done anything together in a while. We felt less worry due to being outside and most importantly since almost everyone was fully vaccinated. We still were careful and spread out as we hiked along. Changing up our pace to exchange conversation and partners so we could speak to everyone.

As to the new bike path and the bridge, my friend Linda and I dreamt of this years ago on a bike ride around town and thought "wouldn't it be great if we could get over to the other side" and the next day I read in the paper that they were actually going to do it! It's taken years, a lot of planning and \$6M to build it.

I still can't believe the Metroparks spent all that money on this project, including the raised path by the water treatment plant. We had to walk on the road past that unfinished section, but the rest of the path is asphalt and nice for walking, so much better than the overgrown, rock and glass strewn road it was previously.

It's so impressive to see the bridge being built. They used two large cranes to lift the decking and the span in place with two smaller cranes on either side where workers were tied off to weld it into place. Check out the You Tube videos because I'm not sure the pictures posted here do it justice.



We walked along the causeway to the former Coast Guard Station which is now a rowing and sailing center. It is so scenic out there with the unique "Streamline Moderne" style buildings and the 60-foot-tall observation tower designed by Milton Dyer. It resembles something that Franklin Lloyd Wright might have designed with its rounded corners shaped vaguely like a ship. Add to that charm (it's been added to the National Register of Historic Places), the beauty of the lake, the views of the city, the blue sky, and the ore ship, the "American Courage," passing by, it was the perfect place to pose for pictures...



On the way back, we took the path leading up into the neighborhood above Edgewater where so many good places to eat and socialize are located. We took the route that connects to West 65th Street and Stone Mad, our dinner destination with some of the group electing to walk back to their cars at Edgewater. I was pleased that everyone came for dinner. We were all able to get seated on the outdoor patio which is so unique with its stone tables, benches, and waterfall. Even though it was a bit cool that day it was still nice, and we were plenty warm from our walk. Great food and drink...toasting to a great day out!

The bike path and bridge is supposed to be completed in early summer and as soon as it is complete, we will be riding it! This hike was just to scope it out for that future bike ride. So, get your bike in shape because before you know it, the path will be open and we'll be riding it soon! Camping and Boating Weekend—2021

Dates: Friday evening, Aug 6 thru Sunday August 8 (check-in at 3 pm Friday; check-out at 1 pm Sunday)

Come join us at Findley State Park for a camping weekend. We hope to repeat the good weather, good food and great company from the last 3 years. We've reserved 5 side-by-side non-electric campsites and plan to make use of Findley Lake and the hiking trails.

Location: Findley State Park is south of Wellington, on SR 58. It has 2 boat launch ramps, hiking, disk golf, and a mountain bike trail. One of the 2 boat launches is in the campground; the other launch ramp has a handicap accessible ramp for launching and retrieving kayaks.



Bring your own camping gear and cooking gear, beverages and food.

The **\$32 fee per person** will pay for the campsites for the weekend, and Friday night sub sandwiches (easy on the cook), firewood, at minimum. If more than the break-even number of participants sign up, more food will be provided by the club as funds allow.

We will bring three single kayaks, a tandem kayak, and a stand-up paddleboard, to be shared. Also, there are kayaks and canoes available for rent from the concession stand at the swim beach.

Space is limited to 20 Participants with 2 tents and cars per site. For more information contact the Activity VP at activity@lewisskiclub.org. Reservations can be made at the lewisskiclub.org website. Reservations by July 8 are strongly suggested, as we will release unclaimed sites on that date.
