Saturday, Sept 25th "Bike-N-Ride" — Enjoy the Cuyahoga Valley National Park on the Cuyahoga Valley Scenic Railroad (CVSR) and towpath trail.



Bike the trails and ride the rails! Ride the train one direction and bike back to your starting point or vice versa. Meet at the Boston Mills station parking lot at 10am. We'll

determine how far we'll ride before hopping on the train for the ride back. Bike Aboard is \$5 per person ONE WAY and is paid upon boarding (ages 3 and older). Cash is preferred and exact change is appreciated. If you can't make it on September 25th, try it some other time.
