Message From the Alpine VP

Are you ready for winter? I know so many who

have already booked their trips, checked their equipment, and are anxiously awaiting the arrival of snow. But not all of us are quite so prepared. Don't worry, we have our friend Dan From Village Ski and Snowboard joining us at our November 12th general meeting to share what's new for 2025. Please plan to join us. We have two daytrips planned to Holiday Valley with a dinner stop in Ellicottville on Friday January 17th and February 14th for the low price of \$123. Price includes lift ticket, bus transportation, morning snacks and hydration, along with driver gratuity. We are ride sharing with the Suburban Ski Club again so seats will be limited to 25. Please take advantage of our temporary price reduction with our annual membership fees. Our two extended trips for 2025 have had challenges in meeting expected participation but we have crossed that hurdle. There are still spots

available for both Copper Mountain, Co and Mount Snow, Vt. The skiing and riding at Copper Mountain resort offers naturally divided terrain. The west side of the mountain offers long easy green runs great for beginners and children. As you move east toward the Center and East Village, the difficulty in terrain increases. Mount Snow opened in 1954 as one of the first resorts on the East Coast. The elevation is 3600' on the summit with 601 acres of skiable terrain with an average snowfall of 150". Mount Snow has 19 lifts and 8 Terrain parks. We're taking the train east and flying west. There's still room on both of these adventures if you would like to join us. We are looking for a few more folks to join us on our trip to Copper Mountain, CO from Sunday, January 26 to Saturday, February 1, 2025.


