Proposed Constitution Changes

The Constitution Review Committee has suggested, after discussions with the Executive Board, several changes to our Club Constitution. Theses changes are as follows, which will be discussed and voted on at the March Club Membership Meeting:

1. To allow Activity Coordinators to continue to be compensated for their efforts, change By-Law 5 as follows:

Fees charged to activity participants may not be increased beyond the estimated perperson costs charged by purveyors of goods and services for an activity in order to reduce the fee charged to the Activity Coordinator for the activity. However, in no event may the fee be reduced by more than the actual cost of travel, lodging, or lift tickets (for up to 5 days).

2. To allow willing Club officers to continue serving, change Article IV, Section 8 as follows:

No president or treasurer shall hold the same <u>that</u> office for a period of more than five consecutive terms.
